

ANNUAL NOTIFICATIONS

ASBESTOS INSPECTIONS AND MANAGEMENT PLANS

The Palermo Union School District hires HAZARD MANAGEMENT SERVICES, INC. to complete the required three-year re-inspection of all asbestos-containing building materials in the district. The district performs the *required* six-month surveillance. This information and the re-inspection data is incorporated into the district's management plan available for review at the district office. If copies of the plan are desired a nominal duplicating fee may be charged.

WATER QUALITY TESTING PROGRAM

South Feather Water and Power routinely tests the water as per state and county regulations for Helen Wilcox School, Golden Hills Elementary School, and Palermo School. The district routinely and regularly monitors and tests the well water at Honcut School contracting with Culligan and Fruit Growers Laboratory to perform collection and testing routines as per state and county regulations. A Site Water Monitoring Plan available for review at the district office. If copies of the plan are desired a nominal duplicating fee may be charged.

PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS

The Healthy Schools Act of 2000 requires California school districts to notify parents/guardians of expected pesticide use on school sites. Terminex of Chico and district staff will spray (all purpose) on the **first Friday of each month**. The spraying takes place after students have gone home and a notice is posted. A list identifying the active ingredient in each pesticide product used is available at the district office. Parents may request notification of individual pesticide applications at the school site. Individuals listed on this registry will be notified at least 72 hours before pesticides are applied.

NOTIFICATION REGARDING SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION

The district is required to notify parents regarding registered sex offenders who reside within our district. The California Department of Justice database of registered sex offenders is available for viewing at the Butte County Sheriff's Office. If law enforcement notifies the district of the presence of a sex offender within district boundaries, the superintendent shall determine which school staff needs to be notified:

- a. Principal at the school in the attendance area of the sex offender's residence or place of employment.
- b. Teachers and classified personnel at the school including staff responsible for visitor registration.
- c. Bus drivers
- d. Yard supervisors.

If an identified sex offender is seen on or near school grounds or around any student, the superintendent and the Butte County Sheriff's Office shall be contacted immediately.

A staff member who receives any information directly from law enforcement regarding registered sex offenders shall immediately contact the superintendent.

If the superintendent believes that parents/guardians should be notified of the presence of either a "high risk" or "serious" sex offender in the community, the superintendent shall contact local law enforcement and ask that agency to conduct a broader notification in accordance with the law.
